

INDIANAPOLIS YACHT CLUB

MEMBER RULES, GUIDELINES and INFORMATION

The following rules are designed to provide maximum safety and security, and to establish guidelines for the membership and guests of the Indianapolis Yacht Club, Incorporated (hereinafter "IYC"). The rules are listed in no particular order of importance. Any conflicts to or observations of violations to these rules and guidelines should be brought to the attention of the Club Manager, any Club Officer, or the IYC Board of Directors for corrective action as warranted. These rules are published annually in this IYC Roster. From time to time the IYC Board of Directors may make urgent revisions or additions to these rules and all members should read their IYC Newsletter for notification of any such changes. In addition, all such revisions or additions will also be posted on the three IYC bulletin boards (main floor lobby, lower level lobby and at dock entrance gate) for the convenience of the membership.

I. DEFINITIONS

1. A. **IYC:** Indianapolis Yacht Club, Inc.
- B. **IYC REALTY CORPORATION:** The legal holder of all IYC real property.
2. **Member Classes:** Individuals or entity named on IYC membership application, and, if the named applicant is an individual, the married spouse (man and woman) of the named applicant, both in good standing with IYC with no delinquent fees or dues. Member's child(ren) ages 16 through 25 years, who is/are not married and is/are residing in the member's household, are extended the same IYC responsibilities and privileges as the named member(s), as further specified throughout these Rules, except they are not accorded voting privileges or hold any elected office. The designated classes of membership are as follows:
 - A. **Senior Member (X):** Boating member furnished with a dock space with full boating, clubhouse, pool, social, and grounds privileges.
 - B. **Senior Member with Boat and Personal Water Craft (XP):** Same as Senior Member, plus has a Jet Ski/Personal Water Craft (PWC) dock space or spaces in the designated PWC dock area.
 - C. **Senior Member with Personal Water Craft Only (PX):** Same as Senior Member, but has no boat dock space but does have a Personal Water Craft (PWC) dock space or spaces in the designated Personal Water Craft (PWC) dock area.
 - D. **Social Member (S):** Non-boating member with full clubhouse, pool, social, and grounds privileges.
 - E. **Social Members with Personal Water Craft (SP):** Same as Social Member, plus has a Personal Water Craft (PWC) dock space or spaces in the designated Personal Water Craft (PWC) dock area.
 - F. **Lifetime Member (L):** Specially designated member with full Senior membership privileges as designated in I,2,A above, as approved by unanimous vote of the IYC Board of Directors.
 - G. **Limited Family Member (LF):** Social membership reserved for adult children of a current member (Social, Senior or Life). This membership class has a limited membership term of up to five years, as long as the sponsoring parent remains a member. If the sponsoring parent passes away, the adult child may continue the membership for the remainder of the specified five-year period. This membership has the same benefits designated for a Social Member (See I,2, D above), with annual dues being one-half of the prevailing Social membership dues.
 - H. **Single Member (SS):** Social membership reserved for a single person having no children living in their household. This membership has the same benefits as designated for a Social Member (See I,2,D above), with annual dues being 35% less than the prevailing Social membership dues.
 - I. **Associate Member (AS):** Limited non-boating member with specified use of Clubhouse and/or grounds facilities for personal, social, or business purposes contingent upon completion of a Facilities Use Agreement.
 - J. **Sustaining Member (SU):** A member who moves out of state and wishes to remain affiliated with IYC. Sustaining Members receive all correspondence from IYC and may return to Social or Senior membership at any time by payment of appropriate administrative fees in effect at the time.
 - K. **Honorary Member (H):** Membership conferred upon any person by unanimous vote of the Board of Directors. Honorary members pay no fees or dues and may enjoy all privileges of Social membership, except they cannot vote, hold any elected office in the Club, nor have any right, title or interest in the property or assets of the Corporation.

3. **Guest(s):** Person(s) invited by, or permitted by an IYC member to enter the club and is to be accompanied at all times by the IYC member while on Club grounds, docks, harbor or clubhouse facilities.
4. **Clubhouse:** IYC facility on the IYC grounds.
5. **Pool:** Swimming pool and the contiguously enclosed area around the swimming pool adjacent to the Clubhouse.
6. **Grounds:** IYC owned and/or leased property.
7. **Docks:** Boat spaces, personal water craft spaces, and walkways starting at entrance ramp at the shoreline.
8. **PWC:** Personal water craft (hereinafter "PWC") (e.g. jet ski).
9. **Good Standing:** IYC member whose dues and fees are not in arrears, and who has no known violations of any of the rules of the Corporation (e.g. Bylaws, these stated Rules, etc.).
10. The IYC "**Boating season**" is designated as the period from 15 May to 15 September, inclusive, of each year.

II. MEMBERSHIP

1. Membership privileges in IYC are extended to IYC members in "Good Standing" only. Each "X", "XP", "PX", "SP" and "L" member, and married spouse (when applicable), shall be provided with an entrance access gate card and IYC dock gate entrance key (Y1) at no charge. [Note: "S" members, who may come to the Club by boat, may also be issued a Y1 dock gate entrance key(s).] Replacement or additional entrance gate cards or keys may be purchased from the IYC Security Committee Chairman at the prevailing rate. Gate entrance cards and dock entrance keys are the property of IYC, and may not be duplicated by members. Each "S", "SS", "LF" and "H" members shall receive entrance gate card(s) only, unless they come to the Club by boat or have a personal watercraft docked at IYC. Member(s) terminating IYC membership must return all entrance gate cards and dock entrance keys to the Security Committee Chairman at once.
2. Each member household may obtain two additional entrance access cards for \$25 each for children 16 to 25 years of age and still living in the member's household. Further, each member household may purchase one babysitter/nanny card for \$25. ("each" at end deleted)
3. Effective January 2008, all IYC members and their applicable children, ages 8 to 25 years of age, living in the member's household, will be required to have an IYC issued photo ID badge/card. The photo ID badge/card must be worn and visible at all times whenever on IYC grounds, docks, in the Clubhouse, or within the swimming pool area (of course, not necessary to be worn while in the water). ID badges/cards are issued free of extra charge to members and their family members, as specified in II.2 above. These ID badges/cards are NOT the same as the gate entrance access cards as described in II.1 above. Other family members, grandchildren and guests will be issued a specially colored wrist band while visiting with a member. There is no charge for the wrist bands.
4. Members shall be considerate of other member's property. A member's boat, dock space, PWC or other personal property or equipment must not be used without the owner's permission and without the member present (except as noted in II.11 below).
5. All members are to respect the privacy of IYC members and shall only use the Club lists of names, addresses, telephone numbers, e-mail addresses, and the like, for IYC related purposes, and not for personal business purposes or to pass on to others.
6. Members or guest(s) shall not create excessive noise, wake, or other disturbances. Members are responsible for the actions of their guest(s).
7. Any member's child(ren) under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult IYC member while on IYC grounds
8. Club members may bring immediate family members (defined as: children, parents, grandparents and/or siblings) and member's date or significant other to IYC as guests an unlimited number of times. Other friends/guests may visit the Club a maximum of three times a year, except for those who come specifically to go boating with a member. The three visits per year is defined as total visits, regardless of number of member sponsors.
9. Annual membership dues are payable January 1st of each year and are considered in default if not paid by January 31st of that year. Members in default are subject to loss of their membership in IYC and their boat and/or PWC dock space(s). When submitting dues, members must include the signed Dues Statement and any other required information or forms included with the Dues Statement.
10. Any IYC member found responsible for any damage or loss to another member's property, IYC buildings,

grounds, docks, pool, or equipment shall be responsible for reimbursing IYC or the member for such damage or loss. Intentionally caused damage could result in action by the Board, to the extent of termination of membership. Members shall be responsible for any damage or loss caused by their guests. Damage to club facilities as a result of normal wear and tear or act of God shall be the responsibility of IYC.

11. IYC members shall comply with the rules established for the use of Geist Lake and by any regulatory agencies thereof for the use of the lake.
12. Social members, who are immediate family to a Senior member, and Limited Family members may use the Senior or Life member's water craft in their absence, with their permission.
13. IYC is a member of the Yachting Club of America, and, as such, has "reciprocal status" with hundreds of other yacht clubs across America. Each IYC member shall receive an IYC Membership Card and a Reciprocal Courtesy Card from the Yachting Club of America. Presenting these cards to participating clubs permits your access to member clubs. IYC offers a maximum of three (3) reciprocal visits per person, per year, either as a guest and/or as a reciprocal visitor.

III. CLUBHOUSE AND GROUNDS

1. All IYC members are expected to do their part to keep the clubhouse and grounds neat and clean. It is each member's responsibility to ensure his/her guests obey all rules relating to the clubhouse and grounds, and to cooperate in the proper disposal of all trash.
2. Vehicle gates are to be closed at all times to provide the maximum security for member's personal property and club facilities. The Club Manager, IYC security officers, and/or Board of Director members may have the gate open for certain periods to accommodate expected shipments of supplies, for scheduled private events, for club dinners, etc. Whenever the entrance gate is open, the exit gate must also be open so as to not create a traffic safety problem.
3. Members and guests shall drive slowly and cautiously while on Club grounds, and park only in designated parking spaces. No parking is permitted in circle in front of main clubhouse entrance doors.
4. Members shall keep the pool entrance gate and the dock entrance gates closed and locked at all times, unless otherwise designated by the Security Chairman or during designated special Club events. Assigned gate entrance cards and dock gate keys must remain in the possession of the IYC member.
5. Trash containers are for use only while on IYC grounds, and are not to be used for trash brought in from outside.
6. No IYC property, supplies, furniture, equipment, or the like shall be removed from IYC grounds without prior written approval from the IYC Board of Directors.
7. Requests by members for private use of IYC clubhouse rooms (Main Hall, Mezzanine, Board Room) or its contents for special functions (such as large parties, meetings, weddings, receptions, family reunions, etc.) must be pre-scheduled, submitted and approved by the IYC Clubhouse Scheduling Manager, or designee. Rates for private usage functions are posted on the clubhouse bulletin boards, and are also available upon request from the Club Manager or the Clubhouse Scheduling Manager. The rates posted are the current rates established by the IYC Board of Directors, and are subject to change as determined by the Board.
8. The lower level of the clubhouse shall not be reserved/rented for private use and shall be available for Club members and their guests. IYC members in good standing may schedule an event (e.g. birthday party) for IMMEDIATE FAMILY (married spouse, children, parents, grandparents, and/or siblings ONLY) in the lower level of the clubhouse. Even if the lower level is reserved for a member's event, it shall remain accessible to other members. The member scheduling the event must be present during the entire event. The Club Manager must be contacted to make arrangements for Club member "special" usage, based on availability. A \$100 deposit is required, and is refundable if the area is cleaned and there is no damage. In no case shall attendance at any gathering in the lower level of the clubhouse exceed twenty (20) persons during the boating season (15 May to 15 September inclusive), and forty (40) persons during the off season, regardless of how many Club members sponsor or attend the gathering, without prior approval from the Club Manager or Board of Directors. {Note: Exception is given if inclement weather forces a group meeting on the Club grounds to seek shelter inside.} When a member plans an event in the picnic area of ten (10) or more persons, the member is requested to notify the Club Manager. There are no charges associated with using the picnic area. Groups relating to a member's business, employer, church, school, neighborhood association, or the like, will be considered on a case-by-case basis when submitted to the Scheduling Manager for Board approval. Member scheduling use of the picnic area must limit the number of guests to a maximum of forty (40) during boating season (May 15th through September 15th).

9. Any decorations used in the clubhouse must be used in accordance with the controls established in the usage agreement, and must be removed immediately following the function. At no time shall decorations or signs be attached to clubhouse walls, ceilings or woodwork with tape, thumbtacks, nails, "oily" sticky dough (leaves residue), or adhesives, etc. When decorating the clubhouse for any event all clubhouse surfaces must be protected from damage by anything such as water from floral arrangements, etc.
10. Special or private functions usage of the clubhouse lower level during boating season (May 15th through September 15th) will be limited during peak usage periods (such as holidays, large Private Event use of the clubhouse, and special occasions), and peak swimming hours.
11. Parking is offered on an "as available" basis. Parking may be limited during times of special usage functions, high usage swimming or boating season days, or holiday activities, so the cooperation of IYC members is appreciated. Parking may be limited to one vehicle per family. (Note: Members may need to car pool or make arrangements to shuttle their guests to high usage events.)
12. No animals or pets of any kind are permitted inside the clubhouse (except guide dogs for the blind or other special assistance animals). All pets must be kept on a leash while on IYC grounds or docks. Pets are allowed on the member's watercraft but are not permitted in the picnic area(s), swimming pool area, nor on any of the clubhouse decks.
13. No overnight use of RVs, campers, camping tents, or travel trailers is permitted on IYC grounds.
14. No boats, personal watercraft, trailers, RVs or other equipment are allowed to be parked and/or stored on IYC grounds at any time. No vehicles of any kind are to be left over night in the parking lot unless previous arrangements are made with the Club Manager.
15. Commercial sales and /or demonstrations of boats, other watercraft of any kind, or equipment on IYC grounds are strictly prohibited. The sale or demonstration of a member's personally owned boat, other watercraft, or equipment is permitted, provided the selling member is present.
16. Members and guests assume all related risk when using the outside grill or fire pit located in the picnic area. Safety precautions must be taken to control the size of the fire in the fire pit. Members must attend the fire at all times and extinguish fire completely before leaving the picnic area. (Caution: Do not get water on the fire pit stone when fire pit stones are hot.) Trash or other objects are not to be put into the fire pit.
17. Members or guests may not use fireworks of any kind on IYC grounds and/or docks at any time. The IYC Board of Directors may, on certain special occasions, provide a fireworks show at IYC.
18. No glass objects of any kind are permitted on clubhouse wood deck overlooking the pool area. No smoking is allowed on the clubhouse wood deck overlooking the pool area when any person(s) (swimmers, sunbathers, etc.) is occupying the pool area.
19. No smoking of any kind at any time is permitted inside the clubhouse, around the pool area during summer swimming season, or within 10 feet of any clubhouse entrance. "Butt cans" are provided for your courtesy and compliance.
20. While on IYC grounds, each member's motor vehicle(s) MUST display an IYC identification sticker on the driver's side windshield (inside), or an IYC license plate (preferred-available in Ship Stores).
21. Members are responsible for any hazardous or dangerous materials (e.g. gasoline) in their possession on Club grounds, and are responsible for any spills and/or clean up necessary caused by such materials.
22. The possession, sales, distribution, or use of illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia is strictly prohibited on Club grounds, docks, pool area or in the clubhouse.
23. All televisions, VCRs, and other electronic equipment located within the clubhouse are provided for IYC members and guests to use only. Adult members only are authorized to operate such equipment. No inappropriate viewing of programs is allowed (e.g. sexually provocative programs, X-rated videos, and the like).
24. Members and guests should be aware that most indoor and outdoor facilities at IYC are continuously monitored and digitally recorded for future reference by a sophisticated video surveillance system for security purposes and protection of members' personal property.
25. Members and guests have 24-hour-a-day access to the lower level lobby, restroom and locker areas of the clubhouse via the IYC issued access gate card. The lower level lobby contains a drinking fountain, a fire extinguisher, first aid supplies, a telephone (local calls only), clock and snack, ice and drink vending machines for member's and guest's convenience. All other facilities, games, televisions, and equipment in the lower level of the clubhouse (except grill area) are available for member's and guest's use when open (8 A.M. until 11 P.M. daily). {NOTE: The large lower level room is normally locked between 11P.M and 8 A.M. for security reasons.}

26. All members hosting guests for meals or activities in the IYC clubhouse must sign the Club Guest Book(s). When a large group of guests is involved, indicate the approximate total number of guests rather than each individual's name. The Club Guest Book(s) is(are) located in the main entrance of the clubhouse (upstairs), and on the grill bar in the lower level.
27. IYC reserves the right to remove, or have removed, any persons from the clubhouse or grounds if they are abusive, causing damage to the clubhouse, grounds or the possessions of others, or who have violated any of the IYC stated rules.
28. All members should be aware that the IYC Ship Stores provides clothing and misc. items for sale. Most items include the IYC logo. The Ship Stores display case is located in the lobby of the lower level of the clubhouse, by the pool entrance. See the on-site Club Manager to purchase items at anytime. Items are also periodically sold at IYC social functions.
29. IYC members or guests of members who are under the legal age for drinking alcohol in Indiana, and anyone who is intoxicated will be refused alcoholic beverage service by IYC or its affiliates. Alcoholic beverages purchased in the clubhouse are not permitted to be taken to the parking lot, picnic or dock areas as dictated by our license issued by the Indiana Alcoholic Beverage Commission.
30. In the interest of safety, no one who is dancing in the IYC Clubhouse shall dance while holding any beverage. Additionally, dancing bare-footed or in stocking feet is not recommended due to the possibility of foot injury. IYC will not be held responsible for accidents or injury resulting from members or guests failure to observe this warning.
31. IYC assumes no responsibility for damage or loss of clothing, coats, or other personal items left by members or guests in coatrooms, lockers, locker room areas, rest rooms, or anywhere else in the clubhouse or on Club grounds.
32. IYC is not responsible for any damage or loss to any member's or guest's vehicle, boat, personal watercraft, equipment, tools, or any other personal items brought onto, or used on IYC grounds or docks.
33. Members and guests wearing bathing suits, ball caps/hats, or not wearing footwear **WILL NOT** be permitted in the main hall of the clubhouse at dinner events such as the Club nights, social events, brunches, etc.

IV. DOCKS

1. All persons entering IYC docks do so at their own risk, and no running is permitted on docks. IYC does not carry any insurance covering the property of any member and IYC will not be responsible for any injury or property damage resulting from, caused by, or growing out of the use of the dock and harbor facilities; further all boating members and Social Members with a PWC(s) must agree in writing that they release, discharge and indemnify IYC from any and all liability from loss, injury (including death), or damages to persons (including any guests invited by or permitted by the member to use the Club's facilities) or property (including guest property) sustained while in or on IYC dock or harbor facilities, including, but not limited to: fire, theft, vandalism, windstorm, high or low waters, hail, rain, ice, collision or accident, etc. or any Act of God.
2. No alterations, additions, deletions, or changes of any kind are allowed to docks without prior written approval from the Dock Committee Chairman. A form is available from the Dock Committee Chairman for such requested changes. Installation of boat lifts (including PWC docking ports) and lift covers (BLUE ONLY), must be approved by the Dock Committee Chairman prior to installation.
3. The four IYC courtesy docks, located on the outsides of the ends of Docks "A" and "B", are to be expressly used by guests of IYC Senior members and IYC Social members for short periods only, not to exceed 4 hours, while attending IYC functions or visiting the Club for dinner, etc. Overnight docking of boats is not permitted by non-boating members or guests. The area of the header dock at the bottom of the "U" between Dock "A" and Dock "B" is reserved for loading and/or unloading of passengers only. At no time shall any vessel, not continuously attended by the vessel's operator, be tied up in this space as doing so blocks access to this area for use by others and seriously blocks access to docks "A2" and "B57".
4. IYC Senior members (X, XP, L) in good standing are entitled to one (1) boat dock space. XP and PX members are entitled to one (1) dock space for a PWC depending upon seniority and availability. Additional PWC dock spaces may be assigned, if available, after all members wanting a space have had a chance to obtain at least one.
5. Boat lifts must be maintained in level and a safe and serviceable condition. Boat lift canopy/cover must be maintained in good appearance. Members are responsible for staying within the boundary limits of their assigned dock space, and will be required to immediately correct any encroachment into an adjacent dock

space.

6. Members are required to maintain their assigned dock areas in a clean and orderly manner, maintaining the overall standards established for the docks. The Dock Committee Chairman shall advise any violating member of any required correction(s).
7. Boat and PWC dock space assignments are made on the basis of a member's seniority. A dock selection drawing is conducted before the beginning of each boating season to assign/reassign available spaces. If a boating member or Social member with a PWC(s) who wishes to obtain a dock space and/or PWC(s) space(s) or wishes to change boat and/or PWC spaces is unable to attend the annual drawing, then they may designate any other member (in writing prior to the drawing) to make the selection(s) on their behalf. If a dock space becomes available during the boating season, the Dock Committee Chairman shall coordinate the reassignment of the vacated dock space with any current members or new member who wishes to obtain that space based on seniority. Once a dock or PWC space is vacated, all personal property including lifts must be removed immediately. Failure to remove such personal property within 30 days of the annual dock drawing constitutes abandonment, and, thereby, such personal property becomes the property of IYC, and will be handled at the discretion of IYC.
8. IYC reserves the right to assign all dock spaces. IYC dock spaces are designed to accommodate four (4) classes of boats, depending upon size and type. Permanent dock assignments must conform to the boat fitting the proper space. Boating members changing to a different class (size or type) of boat, or new members desiring a dock space, may be assigned a "temporary" space by the Dock Committee Chairman until a permanent space becomes available. If the dock space is so assigned, the member must relocate to a permanent space according to boat size and type when made available.
9. No additional or new houseboats, or any water craft longer than 34 feet and/or 11'4" wide, shall be allowed a dock space at IYC.
10. Fire extinguishers, first aid supplies, and water safety equipment are available in the dock service boxes located on docks "A" & "B". A battery charger is available in the Dock "A" Box. Dock service boxes should remain locked at all times, and can be opened with the member's Y1 key. Users are responsible for promptly returning all items used when finished using them.
11. Boats or lifts using electrical power must be properly grounded and must meet all current city/county/state/federal regulations and codes in addition to all IYC published rules with regards to safety, electrical warnings, on-site installation and appearance. If member is notified of a deficiency and takes no action within 30 days (or sooner, if so specified), IYC may remove the boat or lift at the member's expense.
12. A member's boat and/or PWC must be docked in the member's assigned space, and any short-term usage of another member's dock space must be with that member's approval only. The Dock Committee Chairman must approve any use of another member's dock space for longer than 48 hours.
13. IYC members are NOT allowed to lease, sublease or let non-members store or use their assigned dock space(s) at any time, for any reason.
14. All litter, trash, cans, bottles, etc. must be removed from docks and placed in provided containers, not thrown in the water.
15. Any damage to IYC docks or other member's equipment caused by a member's watercraft, boat lift, equipment, negligence, or in conjunction with an act from God, shall be the responsibility of the member who owns the item(s) that caused the damage.
16. Any member who intends to install any boat lift or other personal property or equipment that must be attached to the IYC dock in any substantial way must get prior written approval from the IYC Dock Committee and the IYC Board of Directors to do so. The owner of such lift or equipment must deposit a sum of \$500 with IYC to be held by IYC to pay for the repair of any damage caused by such equipment after its removal at which time the deposit will be promptly returned if no damage has occurred. From the time of its installation until it is removed, any damage caused by such equipment shall be repaired by and paid for by IYC. The member will then be billed for the repairs and must immediately reimburse IYC. The \$500 deposit will continue to be held by IYC as noted above. Members who have added dock fingers for floating boat lifts may be able to donate the dock finger to IYC when they drop from IYC membership. (Check with the IYC Dock Master, if applicable)
17. Beginning in 2006, any new occupants of 30 foot long slips on the outside of Dock "B" will begin paying a \$300 annual surcharge for those slips. Members holding those spaces prior to 2006 are grandfathered and will not have to pay the surcharge.
18. In an attempt to protect member's personal equipment from damage caused by ice when the lake freezes, IYC provides a system of ice-cutting pumps to keep the IYC harbor relatively free of ice. However,

because IYC cannot guarantee equipment free of breakdown, or continued electrical service without interruption, IYC cannot be held responsible for any damage that ice in the lake may cause to a member's personally owned equipment. i.e. boat lifts, etc.

V. GUESTS

1. Hosting IYC members are responsible for advising their guest(s) of Club rules and looking after their guest(s)' safety while at the Club.
2. Members are responsible for making arrival arrangements with their guests if they do not accompany them to the club. Members are responsible for opening the vehicle access gates for their guests as required. It is specifically NOT the responsibility of the Club Manager to open access gates for the convenience of members or guests and must not be asked to do so except in the case of medical or other dire emergency. Members are not permitted to allow guests to use their assigned access gate entrance cards or IYC keys.
3. All guests must be accompanied at all times by an IYC member. A member's adult child(ren), as defined in I,2 above, shall have no more than three (3) guests at any time without the member (parent) present.
4. Members may have the same guest to IYC (adult or child) a maximum of three (3) visits during any given calendar year. A \$3.00 per visit, per guest, usage fee will be charged for the fourth visit and any visit thereafter during the year. This rule applies to IYC events and pool usage. (Also reference II.8 above.)
5. Members are not permitted to allow guests to use a member's boat, other water craft, dock, gate entrance card, gate key, or the IYC clubhouse or facilities in the member's absence.
6. Any person(s) conducting business on IYC grounds or docks on a member's behalf (e.g. boat/motor repair, lift installation/repair, etc.) must be accompanied by an IYC member, the Club Manager, the Dock Committee Chairman, or an Officer or Director of IYC, as requested by the member having such business conducted. No such person(s) shall be on Club grounds unaccompanied unless authorized in writing by the IYC Board of Directors.
6. A member may work on his own boat or other personally owned equipment if such work does not interfere with the rights, privileges and safety of other member's or guests persons or property. If a member is paying an outside mechanic, craftsman or any other person to perform any work on the member's boat or other personally owned equipment at or on the IYC docks, such outside person must first supply IYC or the Club Manager with a standard certificate of workman's compensation and liability coverage and must sign a hold-harmless agreement naming IYC, Inc. and the IYC Realty Corporation as named insured in order to protect the health and safety, welfare and property of other members.

VI. WATER CRAFT

1. All water craft (boats, PWCs, other) belonging to an IYC member MUST have the member's assigned "X" or "S" number affixed on each side of water craft in the rear quarter. The numbers should be at least two inches (2") in height on all boats and PWCs.
2. All boats and water craft must be well maintained at all times. The Dock Committee Chairman shall periodically inspect for safety and general appearance, and will apprise owner members of any violations needing corrective action. Members not taking corrective action in a timely manner shall be considered not in "good standing" (See I,9 above), and subject to further action as determined by the IYC Board.
3. It is highly recommended that all boating members equip their watercraft in compliance with Indiana State laws and U.S. Coast Guard regulations.
4. All watercraft shall observe the idle speed and "NO WAKE" rule while in the IYC harbor/dock area.
5. All members docking a boat or personal watercraft (e.g. jet ski) at IYC must complete, sign and submit an "Indianapolis Yacht Club, Inc. Boating Agreement" form to IYC each year. (Forms available from the IYC Club Manager) In addition, member must provide IYC with a copy of applicable insurance policy declarations of coverage, showing the various types of coverage, and amount of coverage for each boat/personal watercraft using or occupying dock(s) at IYC. The minimum coverage limits for the insurance policy(s) shall be: \$100,000 for personal injury or property damage per occurrence, and \$1000 for medical payments per occurrence. The policy(s) must be maintained in force while the vessel(s) are occupying IYC docks. Failure to comply with the above may lead to loss of dock(s) space(s), and/ or even termination of membership. Any non-boating member of IYC who comes to IYC by boat/personal watercraft are responsible for any damage to IYC or IYC member property and should, for their own protection and IYC's, ensure that the guest's watercraft are properly insured, as defined above.
6. PWC floating docking ports attached to the specially designed IYC header dock must use at least two (2) hinged attaching points (one on either side of the front of the lift).

7. In case of an emergency, as determined by IYC management, IYC reserves the right to do whatever it deems necessary to keep the member's boat or personal equipment safe or to protect the general welfare of IYC docks or other equipment. In no circumstance shall IYC be required to provide such a service to its membership. In general, each member shall be solely responsible for any and all emergency measures and IYC shall not be held liable for attempting to save or rescue a member's boat or equipment from peril. Boating members are encouraged to continually check the status of their boating equipment, especially after severe storms and periods of high or low water levels.
8. In the event that a member's vessel sinks for any reason whatsoever, while berthed in a slip, at dockside, or while otherwise occupying waters used by IYC as a harbor, IYC may, if the member cannot be contacted immediately and if the sunken vessel constitutes a safety or water navigation hazard to other boaters, take immediate steps to raise and remove and/or repair the vessel at the member's expense.
9. IYC reserves the right to move the member's boat or other equipment if it becomes necessary to make emergency repairs or alterations to any IYC dock or equipment. In the event that such work is planned ahead, then attempts to notify each member affected will be made.
10. The use of open flames, torches, inflammable or toxic removers, or any other hazardous material or hazardous equipment is prohibited on club grounds, docks or member's boat while in the IYC harbor.
11. IYC cannot guarantee that electrical power will not be interrupted and thus cannot be held responsible for any damage or loss caused by such interruption.

VII. SWIMMING POOL

1. Persons using the swimming pool or pool area do so at their own risk. IYC does not provide a lifeguard for the protection of swimmers. Children under the age of 16 are not permitted to use the pool without a consenting adult (18 years of age or older) present in the pool area.
2. An IYC Staff/Pool Attendant (18 years of age or older) shall be on duty during specified days/hours to oversee swimming pool activities, check for ID badges, register guests, and perform other specified duties. In an emergency, the IYC Staff/Pool Attendant may take appropriate action including attempted rescue and notification of emergency personnel.
3. Swimming pool shall be open to IYC members and their guests as follows, or as otherwise determined by severe weather or other factors ordered by the IYC Board:
 - a. The heated swimming pool normally is open May 1st through September 30th, weather permitting.
 - b. Sunday through Thursday - 8:00 AM to 9:00 PM.
 - c. Friday, Saturday and Holidays - 8:00 AM to 10:00 PM.
 - d. If pool is not open during these hours when you arrive to use the pool, contact the Club Manager, at 335-2582.
4. No glass objects of any kind are permitted inside the pool area.
5. No pets are permitted inside the pool area.
6. Pool capacity of 83 shall be displayed at the swimming pool. Once capacity is achieved, additional persons may not enter the pool area for the purposes of using the pool, but may pass through the area to access the lower level of the clubhouse. Restrictions may be imposed on the number of guests using the pool, primarily on major holidays or other high-usage days.
7. Running, boisterous behavior, rough play, and excessive noise are prohibited in the pool area, showers or dressing/locker rooms, or adjoining areas.
8. Persons having any infectious, communicable diseases, or open wounds/cuts, etc., are prohibited from using the swimming pool.
9. IYC reserves the right to refuse admittance to, or eject, any person(s) from the pool area who is obviously intoxicated, or for failing to comply with any established health and safety regulations or these Club rules.
10. There is no charge for IYC members or their guests to use the dressing/locker room facilities.
11. All persons using the swimming pool must take a shower IMMEDIATELY BEFORE entering pool, as required by Indiana State law.
12. Members and their guests are responsible for providing their own lock to protect personal items when using a locker. Any such lock must be removed from locker once the member/guest leaves the pool area. Failure to remove such lock will result in its removal and disposal by IYC.
13. The swimming pool may not be contracted/rented for private use either exclusively or separately from the clubhouse. (See Clubhouse Usage Agreement.)
14. Injuries, accidents, illnesses, or the like relating to the use of the swimming pool should be reported to the Club Manager at once and such should be reported to the IYC Board as soon as possible for any needed corrective action and possible required reporting to the appropriate government regulatory agencies.

- 15 Sitting on, playing with or stretching the pool divider rope is prohibited. No walking on, jumping on or playing on the pool cover is allowed. Any damage to the pool cover or operating mechanism will be the responsibility of the individual(s) responsible for the damage.
- 16 Associate members do not have any swimming pool privileges unless they are invited guests of a member of another category of IYC membership.
- 17 Only one (1) person is permitted on the diving board at a time.
- 18 A member may have a maximum of twenty (20) guests at the swimming pool at any time, and a responsible member must be present in the area at all times.
- 19 Club Manager, IYC Officers, or IYC Staff members may restrict the use of “toy/recreation” items in the pool/deck area if they are deemed to be a safety hazard or a major nuisance.

NOTE: FAILURE TO OBSERVE THE ABOVE STATED INDIANAPOLIS YACHT CLUB RULES OR OTHER STATED RULES AND REGULATIONS OF IYC OR GOVERNMENT REGULATORY AGENCIES MAY LEAD TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY THE IYC BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND/OR POTENTIAL LOSS OF MEMBERSHIP IN IYC. THE ABOVE STATED RULES ARE SUBJECT TO REVISION AT THE DISCRETION OF THE IYC BOARD OF DIRECTORS.
